We are problem solvers.



If you stopped by Children's Law Center, you would quickly learn what the children of DC know: we are problem solvers.

On any given day, we are helping hundreds of children solve problems that no child should face. No child should have to wonder who to live with when his parents can no longer safely care for him. No child should have to fight for the special education services she needs so she can learn. No child should have to go to court to ensure his landlord fixes the heat and water in his basement apartment during the frigid winter months.

In 2013, we helped more than 5,000 children and their families tackle seemingly insurmountable problems – including 1 of every 8 of the poorest children in the city's poorest neighborhoods. We multiplied this impact by partnering with hundreds of pro bono lawyers, pediatricians and city leaders. As a result of our advocacy both in and out of the courtroom, more District children are on the path to a better education, good health and a stable, loving family.

I am also honored to report that the professionals who are responsible for children's well-being turned to Children's Law Center over and over again during 2013 to ensure the best outcomes for District children:

- The judges of DC Superior Court appointed us to represent many hundreds of children who were abused and neglected or caught in bitter custody battles a big vote of confidence in our tenacious attorneys who fight every day for these vulnerable children.
- Pediatricians, nurses and social workers in five community health centers turned to us to help them identify and resolve the root causes of more than 850 children's health problems.
- The DC Council's Committee on Education asked Children's Law Center to develop recommendations that resulted in three major bills that have been introduced to reform the District's special education system.
- The Bingham McCutchen law firm chose us from among many area nonprofits to partner with them on a signature project to prevent child abuse and neglect and about 100 law firms continue to expand their pro bono partnerships with us.

I hope you will read on to learn more about how we tackle the big problems facing the District's children – and to meet the children who are the reason we do what we do.

Our donors, supporters and partners are the reason <u>we can</u> do what we do. It is because of you that we are making progress on behalf of DC's most vulnerable kids. Thank you for your continued support.

Our Work

Why does an 8-year-old need a lawyer?

What if you've been shuffled from one foster family to another, when all you want is to be reunited with your sisters? Or, you have severe asthma triggered by mold in your bedroom wall that your landlord says isn't his problem to fix? Or, your school refuses to test you for a learning disability even though you still can't say your ABCs in the third grade?

Too many of the District's most vulnerable children are not getting a fair start. Children's Law Center is the voice for these kids. No matter how we meet a child – whether we are appointed by a judge, referred by a pediatrician, or get a call on our legal helpline – we don't give up until that child is on the road to a better future.

In 2013, Children's Law Center helped over 5,000 at-risk children and families attain a quality education, good health and a permanent, loving home.

Meet some of the amazing young people we helped in 2013.



4-year old Journey

was diagnosed just before starting pre-K with a chronic brain disorder that left her tired and weak. In preschool, it became clear that Journey needed special services to get through her day. But, her mother's requests for extra support were stonewalled, and the school even suggested that Journey should transfer if her needs weren't being met. Finally, Journey's mom

met with Children's Law Center. Once our lawyer was involved, school officials suddenly offered forms and questionnaires they had never provided before. We secured several evaluations to help doctors and teachers understand how best to help Journey. And, when Journey's mom decided to switch her daughter to a different school, we helped find one that would better meet Journey's needs. Journey's mom says "my daughter would not be able to go to school safely today if not for one lawyer from Children's Law Center who never gave up."

A good education is a child's building block for future success. But too often a school system fails to provide special services needed to help children with physical, learning or emotional disabilities learn. In 2013, our lawyers helped open educational doors for over 1,500 DC children—just like Journey.

9-year old Rafael*

is one of the many District children who was in and out of emergency rooms due to severe asthma. The trigger? Severe mold. Rafael's pediatrician was concerned about the terrible mold in his apartment, which his mother said was due to a sewage leak that the landlord hadn't fixed for over a year. When we visited, the apartment was even worse than his mother described – the carpet was wet and rotting, it smelled of sewage, and the family had to use a screwdriver to turn the bathroom water on and off. Children's Law Center arranged for a housing inspection, which found levels of airborne mold spores that were literally off the charts and noticeable growth of fecal bacteria in one of the family's bedrooms. After we threatened legal action, the landlord moved the family to a safe unit within just 10 days. And, just a week after the move, Rafael's mom reported that her son's asthma symptoms were almost completely gone.

All parents want their children to be healthy. Through our medical-legal partnerships with Children's National Health System and Mary's Center, our lawyers work side-by-side with pediatricians to find and fix the root causes of a child's health problem. In 2013, we helped over 1,400 children and families solve health problems. As a result, fewer children lived in apartments with toxic mold, fewer Medicaid services were denied to low-income children, and more mental health services were available to children recovering from trauma.

20-year-old David*

helped to care for his younger siblings Teyvon and Teresa for years because his mother suffered from severe epilepsy. When his mother died, he was determined to keep the family together. David and his grandmother were awarded joint custody of his siblings. Then, in 2013, his father returned after many years of being absent and sued for custody. The case went all the way to the DC Court of Appeals. Our lawyers worked with David, his brother and sister, and his grandmother to keep them together. With our appellate team on the case, we helped educate David and his family about the court process and what would be asked of them, put together the arguments necessary to defend the custody ruling, and demonstrated the legal skills necessary to win. As a result, Teyvon and Teresa are at home with David and their grandmother, growing up in a familiar, loving home.

Family is the center of a child's life. In 2013, Children's Law Center helped over 2,500 children and caregivers through our work to create more stable families. Often, we were appointed by the court to represent a child who had been abused or neglected or whose parents were fighting over custody. We also worked with many family members like David and with other caring adults who are seeking to provide permanent homes for the hundreds of foster children in DC.

Why do hundreds of DC's most talented lawyers partner with us?

Though Children's Law Center is the largest non-profit legal provider in DC, many more children come to us than we can help. Pro bono attorneys from the area's top law firms, in-house legal departments, government agencies, and solo practitioners help fill the gap. In 2013, more than 500 lawyers volunteered with us to help vulnerable children and their families navigate special education, guardianship and other cases.

Why? We've heard our world class mentorship, training and written materials help attorneys feel more comfortable as they navigate new areas of law. But at the end of the day, we know it's about the children themselves. Every pro bono attorney we've mentored talks about how deeply touched they are by their experience. Whether it's helping a vulnerable child find the best home to support his recovery from trauma or ensuring a loving mother can finally get her son the special education services he deserves – our cases are life changing.

Policy

How do you make more headway for all DC kids?

We learn something from every child we help. Sometimes, because we assist thousands of children each year, we discover system-wide barriers that if fixed could make a difference for all District children. This is the approach that grounds our policy work.

In 2013, we partnered with the mayor and agency leaders to offer policy solutions based on the real-life experiences of our clients. We testified before the DC Council more than 20 times to press for changes to laws that affect our children. Our policy attorneys also reviewed draft legislation to ensure proposals reflected evidence-based research and best practices. And, our budget advocacy secured resources for the children of DC.


Whether it is improving special education programs within DC schools, ensuring pediatricians screen for children's mental health needs, or pressing agencies to better prepare older youth who age out of the foster care system – our policy advocacy delivers real results that improve children's lives.

Making progress on mental health.

A 2-year-old girl whose mother is shot to death while holding her. A 12-year-old so behind in school she gets depressed and drops out. A homeless 18-year-old who faces daily anxiety about where he will sleep. These are just three of the many faces of children's mental health in the District.

All DC children deserve mental health services that will allow them to learn in school, live with their families, and thrive in our community. That's why in 2013, Children's Law Center released our first report card chronicling the District's improvements and failures in meeting children's mental health needs – a follow-up to comprehensive recommendations we issued a year earlier on how to reform the city's mental health system.

The 2013 Children's Mental Health Report Card showed the District had made a promising start but much more work needs to be done. This message was reinforced by news coverage, including a Washington Post editorial that stated: "The failure to deal with the mental health consequences of exposure to crime, displacement and other issues associated with poverty can doom other reform efforts, such as initiatives to cut dropout rates or reduce the number of children in the child welfare system."
