HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD, and TB Administration (HAHSTA)

HAHSTA is the core D.C. governmental agency tasked with working to prevent and reduce the transmission of HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STDs, and TB. HAHSTA also works to provide treatment to persons with the diseases. HAHSTA partners with health and community-based organizations to offer testing, counseling, prevention, education, intervention, medical support, housing, nutrition, personal care, emergency services, free medication, and insurance. The HAHSTA website provides information about how to access services in D.C. Moreover, HAHSTA has partnered with D.C. TAKES ON HIV (dctakesonhiv.com) to provide additional HIV-related resources, including testing site locations in the D.C. area.

The D.C. Department of Health provides Sexually Transmitted Disease services through the Southeast STD Clinic located at D.C. General Hospital Campus. Services provided by the clinic include comprehensive STD testing for persons over 12 years old, STD diagnosis and treatment, and Hepatitis A & B vaccinations. The clinic further provides free education and counseling as well as access to free condoms. DC's new Health and Wellness Center, located at 77 P Street NE also provides a similar set of services, as well as referrals for conditions that the Center does not treat.

Metro TeenAIDS provides resources to advance the overall health of at-risk and HIV-infected adolescents by providing resources to help teens fight AIDS and support each other. Among other services, Metro TeenAids offers free counseling, testing, and referrals to youth; provides support to adolescents living with HIV; engages in risk-reduction counseling; and provides capacity building assistance to youth-serving organizations in D.C. Through their Stable Families program, Metro TeenAIDS also utilizes a community-based collaborative model to help ensure families affected by HIV are receiving high quality and coordinated service provision.

The D.C. Abortion Fund

The D.C. Abortion Fund (DCAF) makes financial grants to women in D.C., Maryland, and Virginia who cannot afford the full-cost of an abortion. The following are eligible for DCAF assistance:

- Residents of D.C., Maryland, and Virginia;
- Women coming to the D.C. region from outside of the above areas;
- Women who are 7+ weeks into pregnancy, with priority given to the second trimester;
- Exceptions to these requirements will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

To access funding, call DCAF's free, confidential helpline at 202-452-7464 and leave a voicemail for a case manager. Include your name and phone number, how many weeks pregnant you are, the date of your doctor's appointment, and whether or not it is okay for us to leave you a voicemail. In order to protect privacy, DCAF does not provide assistance via email.

Planned Parenthood's Washington, DC location, in the Carol Whitehill Moses Center, near the NOMA-Gallaudet Metro Station, provides abortion services, including offering the abortion pill, or medication abortion, to women up to 9 weeks after the start of their last menstrual cycle and in-clinic abortions for women up to 19 weeks and 6 days past the start of their last cycle. The Center also provides pre-and post-abortion education, post-abortion follow-up exams, and referrals to other abortion services as needed. Services are available in English and Spanish, with telephone interpretation available for other languages.

The Potomac Family Planning Center has a location in Rockville, MD (its former Washington DC center has closed) which offers surgical abortions to women between 5 and 16 weeks from their last menstrual cycle and medication abortion for women over 18 years old up to 56 days from their last menstrual cycle. The staff is composed of licensed gynecologists, registered nurses, counselors, and medical assistants.

The Washington Surgi-Clinic provides both surgical and non-surgical abortions from the early stages of pregnancy through 26 weeks. First trimester surgical abortions can be performed beginning at 5 weeks from the last menstrual cycle, while second trimester surgical abortions are performed between 12 and 26 weeks of pregnancy. Medication abortions may be offered to women up to 6 weeks after the date of their last menstrual cycle.

The Northwest Center's Pregnancy Center is a community outreach program that provides free, confidential services, including pregnancy testing, options counseling, health education, and material assistance. In addition, counselors can make referrals for services in the following areas: prenatal care, medical care, adoption, domestic violence, legal services, housing, educational opportunities, and job training. The Northwest Center also runs a Maternity Home, which provides transitional housing for pregnant women ages 18-30. The Maternity Home program offers life skills training, case management services, access to health care, assistance with referrals for day care or other community-based agencies, and development of interpersonal communication skills.
