

TANF is Critical in the Face of Federal Safety Net Cuts

TANF cuts adopted in DC's FY 2026 budget will **multiply the harm** that the federal government is inflicting on families and children through extensive cuts to health insurance, food assistance, and housing supports.

Federal Cuts to Medicaid, SNAP and Housing Assistance will Harm Millions, including Thousands in DC

- ▶ As a result of the Omnibus Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA), about 10 million people nationwide will lose health insurance by 2034. About 29,000 people in DC will lose insurance just due to federal Medicaid cuts.¹
- ▶ OBBA implementation will cause 18,000 families in DC, including 5,000 families with children, to lose at least \$25 per month in SNAP benefits.²
- ▶ Congress is considering budget legislation which may cause up to 4,000 District residents to lose access to homelessness assistance and housing vouchers.³

Instead of shoring up the safety net, the District has adopted TANF cuts that will make it impossible for families to provide for themselves and their children.

- ▶ Eliminating the COLA will mean that TANF benefits will remain stagnant while prices continue to increase.
- ▶ Time limit reductions and stricter work sanctions will result in families – many of whom face significant barriers to obtaining and keeping employment – having even less capacity to absorb cuts to benefits.

The Council must restore \$106,767,000 in funding to TANF over FY27 through FY29 in order to reverse these harmful cuts.
